General Competition Guide



Entry Information

- Entries should be submitted via the [membership portal](#).
- A waiting list will be in operation as soon as the event is filled. Once you have been moved from the waiting list, you will be given a 48-hour window to accept and pay for your place.
- It's recommended that you log into your account ahead of the entry opening date to ensure details of people you wish to enter are up to date and hold a valid Archery GB membership.
- Please ensure the organisers are aware of any special requirements you may have. Archers who are unable to get to the target, please try to arrange for assistance to aid in scoring and arrow collection. If this is not possible, please contact the organiser directly who will assist. This must be least 7 days prior to entry.
- By entering an Archery GB competition, you agree that the following information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems and other competitors and some information may also be published in documents or lists relating to the event, and at a schedule decided by the organisers: name, gender, bow style, date of birth or age category, round, disability information, email address, contact numbers, club, county, region and any Archery GB assigned codes for this information.

Refunds and cancellations

- If you wish to cancel your space and get a refund, please contact competitions@archerygb.org.
- No refunds will be available 28 days prior to the competition date.

Age groups

- **World Archery age groups:**
 - Under 18 – under 17 on 1 January in the year of competition
 - Under 21 – under 20 on 1 January in the year of competition
 - WA Master 50+ – An athlete may participate in a 50+ Class in tournaments when the competition takes place in the year of the athlete's 50th birthday and thereafter
- **Archery GB age groups:**
 - Under 21 – under 20 on 1 January in the year of competition
 - Under 18 – under 17 on 1 January in the year of competition
 - Under 16 – under 15 on 1 January in the year of competition
 - Under 15 – under 14 on 1 January in the year of competition
 - Under 14 – under 13 on 1 January in the year of competition
 - Under 12 – under 11 on 1 January in the year of competition

Documentation and information

- Target lists and results will be published on www.ianseo.net.
- Event notifications will be published at www.archerygb.org and on social media platforms. We recommend you check these regularly leading up to the event.

Line tents

- No tents are to be erected until 4:00pm the day before the competition, unless otherwise stated.

Rounds

- For any further questions regarding the competition round, please reach out to the competition contact found on the Event Guide.

Dress code

- Please refer to the Archery GB Rules of Shooting, rule 307, for the dress regulations.
- Archers should comply with dress regulations throughout the competition until after the presentations.

Practice

- The method and length of practice at each event is detailed the Event guide and will be on www.ianseo.net closer to the event.

Anti-doping

- Archers competing at record status tournaments may be subject to anti-doping testing. Competitors who are approached to give samples must comply. Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result.
- By entering this competition, you consent to anti-doping testing. If you are entering a minor into this competition you consent to the testing of that minor. This is in line with UK Anti-Doping Policy, Rule 5.7.2.

Music

- Music will be played at the certain events and is at the discretion of the Tournament Officer.

Awards

- All trophies must be returned to the Tournament Organiser, unless otherwise stated.
- Medals will be awarded on the following basis:
 - 1-3 archers in category – 1st place awarded only
 - 4-6 archers in a category – 1st and 2nd places awarded only
 - 7+ archers in a category – 1st, 2nd and 3rd places awarded

Event formats

- Event formats can be changed by the competition manager, competition organiser, and Chair of Judges, in collaboration with competitors on the day of the event due to unforeseen circumstances.

Lost arrows

- Lost arrows must be reported to a judge or member of the field party (please remember to inform them if you later find the arrow). It is the archer's responsibility to account for all arrows before leaving the field.

Safeguarding

- The Welfare Officer's information will be added to the relevant competition on lanseo page. More information around safeguarding and behaviour can be found in the [Archery GB Competitions Conduct and Safeguarding document](#).

Photography

- Unauthorised photography is not permitted.
- In line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Policy, those who wish to take photographs or video at this event are to register with the Tournament Secretary on arrival.
- Photos and video taken at this event may be used by Archery GB across its communication channels to promote the sport. If you are concerned about any photography taking place at this event, or do not wish to be photographed, please contact the Tournament Organiser directly. You can request photos to be taken off any AGB channel if you do not wish them to be displayed.

Pavilion Cafe

- At some events, hot and cold food will be available from the Lilleshall shop in the Cricket Pavilion from 8am.
- If the Pavilion Cafe isn't open during the event, we will add this information to lanseo prior to the competition.

Smoking

- Lilleshall's smoking policy states that there is to be no smoking on the sports pitches. The smoking area is on the access road. This rule also applies to those using electronic cigarettes or vaping.
